Scope and Contents

Folder includes a U.S. Land Grant to Colin Black of Marengo County, Alabama, on 25 September 1834, as well as three newspapers: The North Carolina Standard, 3 July 1839, vol. V, no. 244 (Raleigh, NC); The Daily Sun, 16 November 1863, vol. IX, no. 84 (Columbus, GA); and the Mobile Daily Advertiser and Register, vol. V, no. 1700 (Mobile, AL),
